LEGAL FOUNDATION

We, the undersigned parents and legal guardians of [Child's Name], hereby assert our inalienable, constitutionally protected rights under the U.S. Constitution, the District of Columbia Code, federal statutes, and binding international ethical frameworks to refuse participation in school vaccine mandates and any other medical interventions, including but not limited to the Hepatitis B vaccine, Vitamin K injection, MMR, DTaP, varicella, polio, and all other school-required vaccinations.

1. U.S. Constitutional Protections
