# MAINE: School Vaccine Refusal Legal Document

# NEWBORN MEDICAL AND SCHOOL VACCINATION REFUSAL AND PARENTAL RIGHTS ASSERTION

## **LEGAL FOUNDATION**

We, the undersigned parents and legal guardians of [Child's Name], hereby assert our absolute, inalienable, constitutionally protected rights under the U.S. Constitution, the Maine Constitution, applicable federal statutes, and binding international legal and ethical frameworks to refuse participation in school vaccine mandates and any other medical interventions, including but not limited to the Hepatitis B vaccine, Vitamin K injection, MMR, DTaP, varicella, polio, and all other school-required vaccinations.

### 1. U.S. Constitutional Protections

- Fourteenth Amendment (Due Process and Parental Rights): Established in Meyer v. Nebraska, 262 U.S. 390 (1923) and Pierce v. Society of Sisters, 268 U.S. 510 (1925), recognizing the fundamental right of parents to direct the medical care of their children.
- First Amendment (Religious Freedom): Although Maine's 20-A M.R.S. § 6355 eliminated religious and philosophical exemptions (effective September 2021), federal constitutional protections, including the First Amendment, remain binding and supersede conflicting state statutes (Wisconsin v. Yoder, 406 U.S. 205 (1972)).

### 2. Maine Statutory and Case Law

- **20-A M.R.S. § 6355**: Removed religious and philosophical exemptions for school vaccine mandates, leaving only medical exemptions supported by a physician.
- Maine Revised Statutes Title 22 § 1711-C: Codifies the requirement for informed consent for all medical procedures, explicitly protecting a patient's (and by extension, parental) right to refuse medical treatment.

• Maine Constitution, Article I, § 1: Declares that all people have certain natural, inherent, and unalienable rights, including liberty and property, safeguarding parental authority and bodily autonomy.

## 3. Federal Statutory and Ethical Protections

- National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986 (42 U.S.C. § 300aa–1): Establishes a system for vaccine injury compensation and confirms the necessity of informed consent.
- **42 U.S.C. § 1983 (Civil Rights Violations)**: Provides remedies for state violations of federally protected rights, including unauthorized medical interventions.
- 42 U.S.C. § 1395cc(f) (Patient Self-Determination Act): Ensures the right to accept or refuse medical treatment.

### 4. International Ethical Standards

- **Nuremberg Code (1947)**: Mandates that voluntary consent of the human subject is absolutely essential and prohibits coercion.
- Universal Declaration on Bioethics and Human Rights (UNESCO, 2005): Article 6 guarantees the necessity of prior, free, and informed consent for any medical intervention.
- **Declaration of Geneva (World Medical Association)**: Confirms the physician's duty to respect patient autonomy and dignity.

# SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE SUPPORTING REFUSAL

The following scientific evidence demonstrates that **high vaccination rates do not guarantee immunity from outbreaks** and may contribute to **viral transmission, mutation, and persistence**.

- Lewnard JA & Grad YH (2018). "Vaccine waning and mumps resurgence in the United States." Science Translational Medicine, 10(433), eaao5945. Demonstrated waning immunity and outbreaks among vaccinated populations.
- Guerra FM et al. (2017). "The basic reproduction number (R0) of measles: A systematic review." The Lancet Infectious Diseases, 17(12), e420–e428. Found that measles outbreaks occurred in populations with vaccination rates exceeding 95%.
- Rosen JB et al. (2014). "Outbreak of measles among persons with prior evidence of immunity, New York City, 2011." Clinical Infectious Diseases, 58(9), 1205–1210. Documented a measles outbreak initiated and propagated by vaccinated individuals.
- Haber P et al. (2015). "Mumps outbreaks in vaccinated populations United States, 2006–2015." MMWR, 64(48), 1345–1349.

Multiple mumps outbreaks traced to vaccinated populations, highlighting limitations of the vaccines.

• Kennedy DA & Read AF (2017). "Why does drug resistance readily evolve but vaccine resistance does not?" Proceedings of the Royal Society B, 284(1851), 20162562.

Showed that mass vaccination exerts evolutionary pressure on viruses, driving adaptation and mutation.

## **DEMANDS AND DECLARATIONS**

We hereby:
