LEGAL FOUNDATION

1. U.S. Constitutional Protections

- First Amendment (Religious Freedom): Although New York Public Health Law § 2164 eliminated religious exemptions for vaccines (as amended in 2019), federal constitutional protections under the First Amendmentremain in full effect and preempt conflicting state statutes (Wisconsin v. Yoder, 406 U.S. 205 (1972)).

2. New York State Statutory and Case Law

- New York Public Health Law § 2164: While amended to remove religious exemptions, this statute allows for medical exemptions and does not override the constitutional right to informed consent.
- **Public Health Law § 2504**: Recognizes the authority of parents or guardians to make medical decisions on behalf of minor children.

- Family Court Act § 1012 and established case law affirm the constitutional rights of parents to raise and care for their children, absent evidence of abuse or neglect.
- New York Constitution Article I, § 1: Guarantees the right to life, liberty, and due process, encompassing bodily autonomy and parental decision-making.

3. Federal Statutory and Ethical Protections
