LEGAL FOUNDATION

We, the undersigned parents and legal guardians of [Child's Name], hereby assert our inalienable, constitutionally protected rights under the U.S. Constitution, the Vermont Constitution, applicable federal statutes, and binding international ethical frameworks to refuse participation in school vaccine mandates and any other medical interventions, including but not limited to the Hepatitis B vaccine, Vitamin K injection, MMR, DTaP, varicella, polio, and all other school-required vaccinations.

1. U.S. Constitutional Protections

- Fourteenth Amendment (Due Process and Parental Rights): Recognized in Meyer v.
 Nebraska, 262 U.S. 390 (1923) and Pierce v. Society of Sisters, 268 U.S. 510 (1925), affirming the fundamental right of parents to direct their child's medical care.
- First Amendment (Religious Freedom): Though Vermont law no longer recognizes
 philosophical exemptions, federal constitutional protections for religious freedom
 remain enforceable under Wisconsin v. Yoder, 406 U.S. 205 (1972).

2. Vermont Statutory and Case Law

- **18 V.S.A. § 1122:** Philosophical exemptions were eliminated; only medical exemptions are allowed for school-required vaccines.
- 12 V.S.A. § 1909: Requires informed consent for all medical procedures, reinforcing parental rights.
- **Vermont Constitution Ch. I, Art. 10:** Protects inherent and unalienable rights to life and liberty, including bodily autonomy and parental decision-making authority.

• Interpretation: Parents retain full rights to decline non-mandated newborn interventions (such as Vitamin K and Hep B) with proper documentation unless an imminent medical necessity is established.

3. Federal Statutory and Ethical Protections

- National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986 (42 U.S.C. § 300aa–1): Recognizes
 the legal need for informed consent and provides a framework for vaccine injury
 compensation.
