LEGAL FOUNDATION

1. U.S. Constitutional Protections

2. West Virginia Statutory and Case Law

- W. Va. Code § 16-3-4: Requires vaccination for school entry, permitting only medical exemptions.
- W. Va. Const. Art. III, § 10 and common law principles: Recognize parental rights but subordinate them to state public health authority. Interpretation:

While West Virginia's law is among the most restrictive, it does not override **federal constitutional rights** or the requirement of **informed consent** for medical interventions.

• **Informed Consent:** Even within strict vaccination frameworks, parental consent is required for non-mandated newborn procedures, such as Vitamin K injections and Hepatitis B vaccine at birth.

3. Federal Statutory and Ethical Protections

- National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986 (42 U.S.C. § 300aa–1): Establishes a system for vaccine injury compensation and affirms the necessity of informed consent.

DEMANDS AND DECLARATIONS

We hereby:
